Summary results April to June 2024



Overall satisfaction

72.6%



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72.6 people out of 100 reported they are satisfied with the overall service from Progress Housing Group.

These results are for our general needs, independent living, shared owners, supported living and supported housing tenants. Our full results will be available after year-end in April 2025.

Keeping properties in good repair

78.3%

Satisfaction with repairs

78.3 people out of 100 who have received a repair in the past 12 months reported they are satisfied.
