3.3. Type of abuse and neglect

The following tables provide the quantitative data regarding the types of abuse and neglect investigated by SARs, together with a regional breakdown, cross-referencing to age-related data, and comparative analysis with available section 42, Care Act 2014, data. The most common type of abuse in SARs was self-neglect, followed by neglect / omission; however, this is not consistently the case across all regions.

PERSONAL PERSPECTIVES ON SN

"I wouldn't say I'm losing the will to live, that's a bit strong but ... I don't care, I just don't care." "Well I don't know, to be honest. Suddenly one day you think, 'What am I doing here?'"

"My possessions are my family ... I'm very fearful of throwing something away."

"I got it in my head that I'm unimportant, so it doesn't matter what I look like or what I smell like." "I've noticed over the years that I didn't give two monkeys ... I seemed to have plenty of time to do everything but I don't seem to have the time now." "I put everyone else first - and that's how the selfneglect started."

"I can't physically bend down and pick things up."
